URGENT ACTION NEEDED

**HELP ASSURE CONTAMINATED ROCKET & NUCLEAR TEST SITE IS FULLY  
CLEANED UP**

The Santa Susana Field Laboratory (SSFL) overlooking the Western San Fernando Valley and Simi Valley is the site of a partial reactor meltdown and tens of thousands of rocket tests, which have left behind a massive toxic and radioactive legacy. Agreements to clean up the contamination are at risk--your help is needed to ensure full cleanup, as promised.

In 2010, NASA and the Department of Energy (DOE) signed agreements with the California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) committing to clean up all contamination that could be detected. The Boeing Company, which owns most of SSFL, refused to sign a similar agreement and began lobbying to be allowed to not have to clean up most of its contamination. It also worked against the DOE and NASA agreements.

Some people within NASA appear to be pushing to break NASA's cleanup agreement and not clean up most of the contamination on the NASA property. Comments on the Draft Environmental Impact Report are due October 1.

**PLEASE, TODAY, SEND AN EMAIL OR LETTER TO NASA, DEMANDING THAT IT LIVE UP TO ITS BINDING COMMITMENTS IN ITS CLEANUP AGREEMENT AND CLEAN UP ALL THE CONTAMINATION IT CREATED AT SSFL.**
